Course Outline

The purpose of this course is to help students understand ESL teaching methods through principles. Students will learn the basic factors that affect second language acquisition and develop lesson planning and teaching skills. With this knowledge, you will be equipped to become a professional ESL teacher, the kind of person who seeks out new ways to become a better instructor.

Vocabulary acquisition – especially teaching jargon – will be part of your learning experience both in the classroom and with the readings. Make sure you have access to a good dictionary and useful vocabulary learning techniques.
